

## **Rosebay Willowherb**

Epilobium angustifolium L., 1753

This perennial plant forms numerous offshoots from the stump, giving large flower beds where it is planted. Its large glabrous\* stem bears a multitude of long, narrow leaves. Its numerous purplish flowers are grouped in a beautiful terminal spike. In late summer, the plant produces innumerable tiny seeds, surrounded by long bristles, which ensure exceptional wind resistance.

\*Glabrous: in botany, a leaf or stem is hairless when it is not covered with hairs or thorns.

### Not to confuse

Other alpine willowherbs have very narrow leaves and do not even reach 50 cm in height.
