Saxifraga moschata

Saxifraga moschata Wulfen, 1781

This saxifrage is very glandular in all its parts, which makes it sticky to the touch. Its leaves are irregularly cut and have a central groove (small gutter), which does not reach the tip of the leaf. Its whitish petals are not joined.

Not to confuse

The furrowed saxifrage (S. exarata) is characterised by a central furrow reaching the tip of the leaf and by white, joined petals.
